*The community was saddened on Sunday 6th February to learn of the passing of Les Mackenzie. Over the years Les made a significant contribution to the Majors Creek Community being actively involved in the Progress Ass, Bushfire Brigade and the Majors Creek Recreation Reserve Trust. He held the position of Captain of the Bushfire Brigade receiving Life Membership in 2009 and was a current trustee of the Recreation Reserve receiving a Long Service Certificate in 2001. Since his retirement Les took on many projects in the village, namely painting the fence at the entrance to the cemetery, painting the entrance to the Rec Ground and more recently overseeing the refurbishment of the Recreation Hall. He left no stone unturned in seeing this project completed, organising material, painting and co-opting those many volunteers who helped with the project.*

*His most recent project was to clean up the wooded area in the Rec Ground. With his band of helpers, this area was beginning to take shape and he pledged that the project would resume in the autumn.*

*Les kept us all on our toes, always thinking ahead and keeping in contact with those many friends who he co-opted to come along and help with the many tasks. He will be remembered for this.*

*The large number of people from all parts of the district who attended his graveside service in the Majors Creek Cemetery was evidence of the esteem in which he was held. May he Rest in Peace. A job well done.*


